ELCA Youth Gathering – July 24-28, 2022

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and adult leaders gather at the ELCA Youth Gathering. The five-day event is an impressionable time of worship, fun, learning, and faith formation. This year's theme is "Boundless." As described on the Gathering website – *We are bound. Bound by our sin, by the expectations of others, by poverty, by –isms that try to divide us, and by so much more. In a life that often feels as if it has young people in a suffocating grip, we want them to imagine the boundlessness of God: boundless love, boundless creation, boundless forgiveness, boundless invitation, and boundless promise. All offered from a gracious and loving God who knows and adores them. All so abundant and endless it cannot be measured.* Holy Trinity plans to fly to Minneapolis with a group of high school youth for this gathering. A Place Inside of Me, Life Among the Piutes, and Sisters in Arms are additional books for adults and youth that I've read myself or seen as books of note. Whether fiction or nonfiction, this literature intends to expand our awareness, theology and/or acceptance of diverse viewpoints. We hope on the Racial Justice Taskforce that you'll discover how these writings from various generations embrace what it means to be human and to walk in spirit.

A Place Inside of Me: A Poem to Heal the Heart by Zetta Elliott

A young Black boy skateboards and ponders his deep emotions, from joy to sorrow and anger to compassion, but above all, love. For grades K-3. 2020

Life Among the Piutes: Their Wrongs and Claims by Sarah Winnemucca Hopkins

Considered the first autobiography written by a Native American woman and originally published in 1883, this title offers both a memoir of one of the most well-known Native American women and a history of the Piute people during their first forty years of contact with European Americans. Contains some violence.

Sisters in Arms by Kaia Alderson

Grace Steele and Eliza Jones come from completely different backgrounds, but during World War II they both join the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps (WAAC). Not only will they be among the first class of female officers, they are also the first Black women allowed to serve. Available as an audiobook. 2021
