Annual Congregational Meeting is January 22

Holy Trinity’s annual meeting will be Sunday, January 22 at 11:00 am, immediately following the 10:00 worship services. Copies of the 2022 annual report are available for your review prior to the meeting.

Extending Our Caring Ministries with Stephen Ministers

At Holy Trinity’s annual meeting on Sunday, January 22, Council is seeking affirmation from the congregation to include Stephen Ministers among the caring ministries of the congregation. As a supplement to, rather than replacement of, pastoral care, Stephen Ministers are trained to provide confidential, extended one-on-one Christ-like care for persons who are working through a significant loss or transition in their lives, such as the death of a loved one, the loss of a job, a divorce and so on. Local Stephen Leaders receive 20 hours of training for initiating, implementing, staffing and maintaining the ministry in their congregation. Those Stephen Leaders then lead 50 hours of training for Care Givers to prepare for their service to Care Receivers from both the congregation and community-at-large. The training is followed by monthly meetings to provide on-going support for Care Givers in their service.

In order to advance Holy Trinity’s engagement in what it perceives to be a worthwhile addition to our caring ministries, last year Church Council approved training for our first two Stephen Ministry Leaders: Director for Equipping Ministers Laura Hudson and Pastor Steve Wachtman. Council has also identified four people with the gifts and interest to serve as Stephen Minister Care Givers: Ron Benedick, Sharon Kokot, Steve Rice and Cathy Steffen.

A motion at this year’s Annual Meeting seeks to affirm the congregation’s involvement with Stephen Ministry in general and commit its engagement with the ministry going forward. You can learn more about the program after worship this **Sunday, January 15** in the conference room when Pastor Steve and Laura Hudson will offer a brief overview of Stephen Ministry and address any questions you might have.

Make a LutherLand Pilgrimage at a Hostel VALUE: June 14 - 24, 2023

Next summer, seven youth and six adults will embark on Holy Trinity's next Lutherland Pilgrimage, and there's room for 20 more! Staying in shared hostel accommodations as well as host family homes with our partner congregation in Schwerin, we'll travel by motor coach sponsored by a generous donor. **The current land-package cost of this faith-changing pilgrimage is \$1439, which falls to \$1239 for all travelers with one more registration.** Current non-stop airfare estimates departing and returning from Detroit are \$1500.

As with every previous pilgrimage, this experience will include engagement with sites of the Protestant Reformation, our German Partner congregation, and German cultural flavors, sights and sounds. Like previous pilgrimages with youth and adult participants, ample opportunity will be afforded the group to share the experience together and within their peer group.
