On Your Mark ~ Get Set ~ GO!!!

Rally Day is September 10th and we will begin our journey through the second year of the Narrative Lectionary. We are so excited about the themes surrounding the weekly Bible stories that will shape our faith in the coming year.

This fall, as we hear about God working through people in the Old Testament, we will engage in the ways *God works through people like us*. We will consider what it means to be **ON YOUR MARK**, celebrating the gifts with which God has already equipped each of us to serve.

In the winter, we will **GET SET** as we hear stories of Jesus' life in Mark's Gospel and notice how *Jesus transforms people like us for God's work*.

Then in the spring, we will encounter stories of the Holy Spirit at work in the early church while we discover ways that *the Spirit sends people like us to do God's work*. The Spirit tells us to **GO!**

God does not call us simply to remember servants of the past or look forward to service one day in the future. Every day, God calls, transforms and sends us - **HERE AND NOW!** We hope to see you Sunday, September 10th to be **On Your Mark!..... Get Set!.... And GO!!!**

Civic Life and Faith

Adult Faith Formation

9am Sundays, September 10 - October 15

This study curriculum was created by the Task Force on Civic Life and Faith of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and published by the ELCA's churchwide organization as a critical step toward development of a social teaching statement. It is an invitation to learn what the task force has been discussing in regard to civic life and faith, including some of the most fraught questions of our time.

The curriculum invites participants to delve into the nature of politics, the meaning of the Scriptures, the purpose of government, the responsibility of congregations and church-related organizations, First Amendment issues, the relationship of faith-based living and civic life, connections between worship life and serving neighbor in society, the nature of citizenship, and other relevant topics. These are weighty and difficult discussions for people of faith!

Your participation and response within this study will aid the task force as it considers what might be included in the draft social statement on civic life and faith that will be available for comment in 2024. The deadline for response to this study curriculum is October 15, 2023.

As will be evident throughout the study, the task force recognizes how Christians of good will can and do disagree about social issues. Though we are one in Christ and share many basic values such as neighbor love and neighbor justice, studying together can be difficult because social concerns, like political life, are complex and personal, with institutional and structural implications. However, Scripture teaches that the Spirit of Christ is able to guide our discernment and deepen our insights (Romans 12:1-2). We will rely on this truth to ground our dialog and growth through this interaction together.

Supplement music leadership under the direction of the Minister of Music.

Communion Assistant

Distribute wine during communion.

Lay Reader

Read scripture lessons for the congregation.

Assisting Minister

Offer prayers on behalf of the congregation and facilitate the communion process.

Hospitality

Assist with refreshments available before and after worship.

Breakout moderator

Help convene check-in meetings after worship for all youth groups: children, tweens, middle and high school.

Pastoral Comment on Normal Identities

While now known to arise from various factors related to biology, genetics, environment and personal preference, this non-conforming identity has historically been associated with the devil in the Bible, witchcraft among the pious, blasphemy by world religions, deviance, incorrigibility and perversion. And through the years, those forced to conform have performed more poorly in school and work; suffered

physical, mental and emotional illness; and endured the distress of social stigma from family, friends and the wider community.

These dynamics were once related to a non-conforming identity known as left-handedness, which gratefully now is largely accepted and affirmed within mainstream American social norms. And the same dynamics are at play for non-conforming sexual and gender identities.

So for the sake of caring for our neighbors and strengthening community, let's do all we can to accept and affirm those too, especially given the tone of much public discourse on the topic these days. Those non-conforming identities are, in essence, no less normal than being left or right-handed.

Next February I will be leading a Sunday School conversation for youth and adults on "Sexuality, Gender and the Church." If you are interested, please watch for details and join the dialog.
