Each Sunday gathering will begin with brief presentations on the topics above, followed by an opportunity for everyone to respond from their own particular perspective according to these norms for dialog:

- Being prepared to listen and learn.
- Respecting the perspectives and experience of others.
- Speaking only for oneself and the perspective of one's own experience.
- Making sure everyone has a chance to speak once before anyone speaks twice, and so on.

While the dialog will conclude no later than 12:30pm each Sunday, Pastor Steve will be available for additional questions and conversation throughout the week and beyond.

Book Collection Project

Beginning this Sunday, April 7th and continuing through Sunday, May 5th the Tweens will be collecting books for elementary students at schools in Appalachia. While reading supports academic success, it also fosters empathy and emotional intelligence. Learning about the fruits of the Spirit- *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control*- happens through stories we read. Jesus calls us to love our neighbors as ourselves and literature provides opportunities to learn about others.

VOSH/International believes in the freedom to see; providing the gift of vision and eye health to people worldwide. They facilitate the provision and the sustainability of vision care for people who can neither afford nor obtain such care where they live. The goal of VOSH is to increase the global impact whenever possible by supporting sustainable eye clinics, optometry schools and optometric educators in areas lacking sufficient eye care. As of November 2023, there are 106 VOSH chapters in 28 countries across the world working to accomplish their goals. This literature intends to expand our awareness, theology and/or acceptance of diverse viewpoints. We on Neighbor-to-Neighbor hope you'll discover how these writings from various generations embrace what it means to be human and to walk in spirit. ...

The Weight of Blood by Jackson, Tiffany

Madison Washington has always been a target for bullies. She's dealt with it, till the morning her most closely kept secret comes out: Maddy is biracial, but passing for white her entire life. Student leaders come up with a plan to change their image: host the school's first integrated prom as a show of unity. But some of Madison's classmates aren't done with her just yet.

The Loneliest Americans by Kang, Jay Caspian.

In 1965, a new immigration law lifted a century of restrictions against Asian immigrants to the United States. Over the next four decades, millions arrived, with almost no understanding of their new home. This story features Kang and his family as they move from a housing project, to an idyllic college town and eventually to the West Coast. Their story unfolds against the backdrop of millions more immigrants, many of them working-class or undocumented.

Buzzing with Questions by Harrington, Janice.

An award-winning poet and children's author recounts the life of Charles Henry Turner. Turner was a pioneer in animal behavior, an entomologist, a high school science teacher, and a leading African American scientist of his time. For grades 2-4. 2019.
